Anita Lahey's second collection, *Spinning Side Kick*, is a hard-knuckled look at the other half. These lively poems mix a girl-about-town cockiness with an all-too-rare emotional honesty about men, love, and relationships. Whether the subject is a one-man chimney demolition, the lifelong fidelity of seahorses, a lover at war in Afghanistan or a kickboxing match, Lahey confronts the enduring disconnect between the sexes in a language that is slangy and quick, punctuated with jabs. She eyes those moments—in a day, in a life—when the normal clues we rely on disappear, shifting the line between domesticity and danger. In *Spinning Side Kick*, a talented poet returns with sharper aim.

When Barry Allen returns from the Speed Force as the Flash, his reunion is met with mixed emotions, and his personal energy field becomes tainted with a black aura that is slowly destroying him.

Punk was created for the malcontents, something that loner and aspiring drummer Hallie understands all too well. Trapped in a boring suburban life - dysfunctional parents included! - Hallie drowns her angst in the angry songs of Haze, a masked musician who has not been heard from in five years. So naturally she's surprised - and more than a little skeptical - when someone who seems to be Haze starts flirting with her via her favorite photo-sharing app. Is he who he says he is? What does he want from her? The questions only multiply when Hallie - along with bandmate Sarah and aspiring music journalist Steve - roadtrip to Haze's comeback gig to unmask the reclusive musician once and for all.

The 1998 Bienal de São Paulo remade art history from a Brazilian perspective, and presented a new model for exhibition-making in the era of post-colonial globalisation. The show employed the Brazilian notion of anthropophagy as both concept and method, encouraging "contamination" and "cannibalisation" of the canon, alongside an expanded understanding of its pedagogic function for the integration of art, culture and political history. By doing so, it proposed a new model for large-scale curatorial projects that could effectively address non-specialist audiences. Photographs and gallery plans reconstruct this important project, and an essay by Lisette Lagnado provides extensive critical analysis and historical context. Additional texts by Renato Sztutman, Mirtes Marins de Oliveira and Carmen Mörsch and Catrin Seefranz are complemented by recent interviews with curator Paulo Herkenhoff and participating artists.

Insurgencies are at the centre of most of the conflicts that confront the modern world, and they have been since the Second World War.
